Deborah told us that Proposition 57 jeopardizes our safety by letting "bureaucrats" override the California Courts where "sentencing" is handed out by a Judge.

It turns out that Proposition 57 allows violent dangerous and adult career criminals to be released from prison early, included those convicted of "drive-by shootings", "taking of hostages", "arson causing great bodily harm", "assault with a deadly weapon" and other crimes.

# Whining and Fining




