Variety of Programs Provided By ICOE



Todd Evangelist was the first portion of the program and he spoke about the different programs that are available in the community, including the Migrant Program, the Academic Decathlon, Mock Trials, the National History Day Fair, the Spelling B for K through 8th, and the California Educational Job Fair. He spoke about the California Department of Education's ground breaking accountability system known as "The California School Dashboard". He pointed out that the new system (i.e. the dashboard) goes beyond those systems previously available. It is a new website that uses multiple indicators to give a more complete picture as to how the various schools are serving our community. He indicated what it will help support local decision-making and will prove to be much more effective in improving our schools and helping

our students find success. The Academic Performance Index previously relied on test scores to produce a number that offered a limited view of school performance. The new indicators looks at English learner progress (K-12), graduation rates (9-12), suspension rates (K-12), college career readiness (9-12), etc. The local indicators include parent engagement, school climate, and coordination of services for expelled and/or foster youth, etc.

Todd introduced Todd Finnel, who spoke about the changes in the use of funding (i.e. restricted monies, pool funding and local control). He spoke about the local reform plan and increased accountability. There were a number of issues he discussed including the use of "vouchers" and the issue of Public versus Charter Schools. Thank you Todd and Todd for a very good program!
