Todd Evangelist was called on to see if he was going to bet with Bob Mapes for the super bowl, like they did for the Bell Game, the answer


was NO. Todd was asked a question about the Super bowl, and for giving the correct answer Todd was only fined \$25, for a wrong answer it would have been a \$50 fine.



## Program



Belinda Mills, Program Chair for the month introduced, our program today, Arnold Preciado, Assistant Superintendent. Arnold presented an update on Measure K and showed the plans for the new STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) Building. Last summer the "old" Business building (over 100 years old) was razed. He mentioned that in order to complete the project and make room for a fire lane one tennis court had to be demolished. Arnold showed the approved plans for the building which will be two stories with both wet and dry science labs on the second floor. Math will also have classrooms. To meet the needs of "Special Needs Students" an elevator will also be



built into the facility. Overall there will be a total of 33 classrooms, teacher staff/lounge room, restrooms, storage room, etc. In the front will be an amphitheater for outdoor performances and other activities. This building will be a state of the "ART" facility.

Arnold also told the Rotary Club about the proposed Aquatic Center that is being planned for the Southwest High School Campus. While the plans are not yet completed and approved by the DSA the pool will meet the length and depth for competition. The pool will have some type of sun shade but will not be a covered facility.
