Sebio Arballo and Lee Hiindman, club board members, helped welcome James Taylor into the club by "pinning" him and giving him a welcome packet.






The pot today was \$184 and Cliff Caldwell had the lucky ticket, however he left \$1588 in the big pot for the next meeting.


MYSTERY TRIP - MAY 24, 2012
